

Primary School Sports Grant Impact and Evaluation Report Academic Year 2014/15

Context of Academy

We are a new Primary Academy which converted on 1st April 2014 with School Partnership Trust Academies as our sponsor. We formed from the merger of an Infant and Junior school and we are excited about our future. We have children at the heart of our work and consequently have a committed and very friendly staff. Everyone feels welcomed in the school; it is a happy place to be.

The Academy serves a community where there are high levels of deprivation and we do have children with significant emotional need. However, we are proud of the progress our children are now making and their willingness to try their best to achieve. They want to succeed and all of our team are committed to helping to fulfil the ambitions of our young people. Our school motto is "Together Everyone Achieves More" this is a firm belief that drives the way we work.

We have placed a great emphasis upon widening opportunities for our children and have an extensive programme of extra-curricular activities. Our young people have gained success in Football, School Olympics, Curling and Cross Country to name but a few.

Summary of PSSG Spending

A PE instructor was appointed in December 2014. A considered approach to resourcing and a review of how PE and sport were delivered were the first steps. Some key areas for development were then prioritised including purchasing a new scheme of work for planning PE.

PE and sport now form a large part of the school day. Over the lunchtime period there are supervised activities led by the PE instructor and support staff. In addition, free after school sports clubs are run most nights to encourage active lifestyles.

Membership of the school sports partnership run by Baysgarth School enables the school to participate in inter-school sports tournaments and access additional training and resources throughout the year. Children have the opportunity to access alternative venues for team sports and this in turn supports transition to secondary school.

In part, PPA time is also covered with sporting activities led by the PE Instructor, support staff, external coaches and dance tutors which ensures that the children have regular timetabled sporting activity as part of the curriculum.

Implications for PSSG in 2015/16

The impact of the sport grant expenditure from 2014/15 will be reviewed by the PE Instructor.

The children will be asked for their views of PE and Sport in school.

The children will be asked for their views of the sports based after school activity clubs.

The number of children accessing these clubs will be reviewed to ensure all children have been given the opportunity to take part.

Children with specific sports interests and those who show skill and aptitude in a certain sport will be encouraged to attend appropriate clubs and activities. This may include the school contacting or introducing outside sporting organisations on their behalf.

Further investment in equipment is planned for 2015/16 for indoor and outdoor sports and lunchtime activities to broaden the variety of equipment on offer and further encourage participation.

The school will continue with its membership of the Sports Partnership to further promote the advancement of PE both through participation and by developing staff in delivering quality PE and sports provision.
